SUGGESTIONS FOR FREE TELECOLLABORATIVE APPS

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • iOS, Android • Collaborative video editing, • Add users and invite collaborators through Facebook, email, text message, QR code. • Up to 1 hour video. Add up to 256 scenes (video clips and images) • Add text over scenes, apply themes and music from built-in libraries. • Upload final video to YouTube, social media; share via email, text message; download into camera roll.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • iOS, Android, (Windows and Mac) • Recorded video chat with multi-participants • Up to 8 hour live streaming/archived video. Length of video depends on resolution settings or configuration of device. • Set privacy to public, private or unlisted, pre-post recording. • Must initiate session from a web browser. • Invite collaborators by sharing a link or by adding Gmail usernames. • Participants can join from mobile devices using Google Hangouts on Air • Screen-sharing (web only) audio/video control room. • Live chat with audience, can assign moderators to chat, set slow mode, block spam. • Public sessions: announce upcoming live sessions on your YouTube channel, embed on websites, enable chat.
