This academic year, the ILETC and CILC teams have launched two research projects which focus on learners at minority serving institutions (MSI).

The Text-Based Effectiveness Research (TxBER) project (cilc.commons.gc.cuny.edu/text-based-effectiveness-

<u>research</u>), conducted in partnership with Lehman College and Hunter College, investigates the effectiveness of textbased tasks on the development of second language writing in Japanese and Spanish.

The Language Placement for Equitable Learning (LAPEL) project (<u>iletc.commons.gc.cuny.edu/language-placement-for-equitable-learning</u>), in partnership with John Jay College, investigates cost-effective ways of assessing the proficiency of heritage language learners.
